Outcome of Tokyo Summit : \$4.5 billions

The summit of the five major powers in Tokyo, which opened on Monday, has produced a landmark agreement to provide \$4.5 billion in aid to Afghanistan over the next five years.

The aid will be provided in three stages: \$1.5 billion in 1980, \$1.5 billion in 1981 and \$1.5 billion in 1982. The aid will be used for a wide range of purposes, including the reconstruction of the country's infrastructure, the provision of medical and educational services, and the training of Afghan forces.

The aid will be provided through the United Nations, which will act as the intermediary between the donor countries and the Afghan government. The aid will be provided in the form of grants, not loans, and will be provided on a non-refundable basis.
